Also my apologies for not being able to attend tonight, as I have to be in Bali, but I wish you all the best in the future and hopefully the success the Club deserves will come your way.

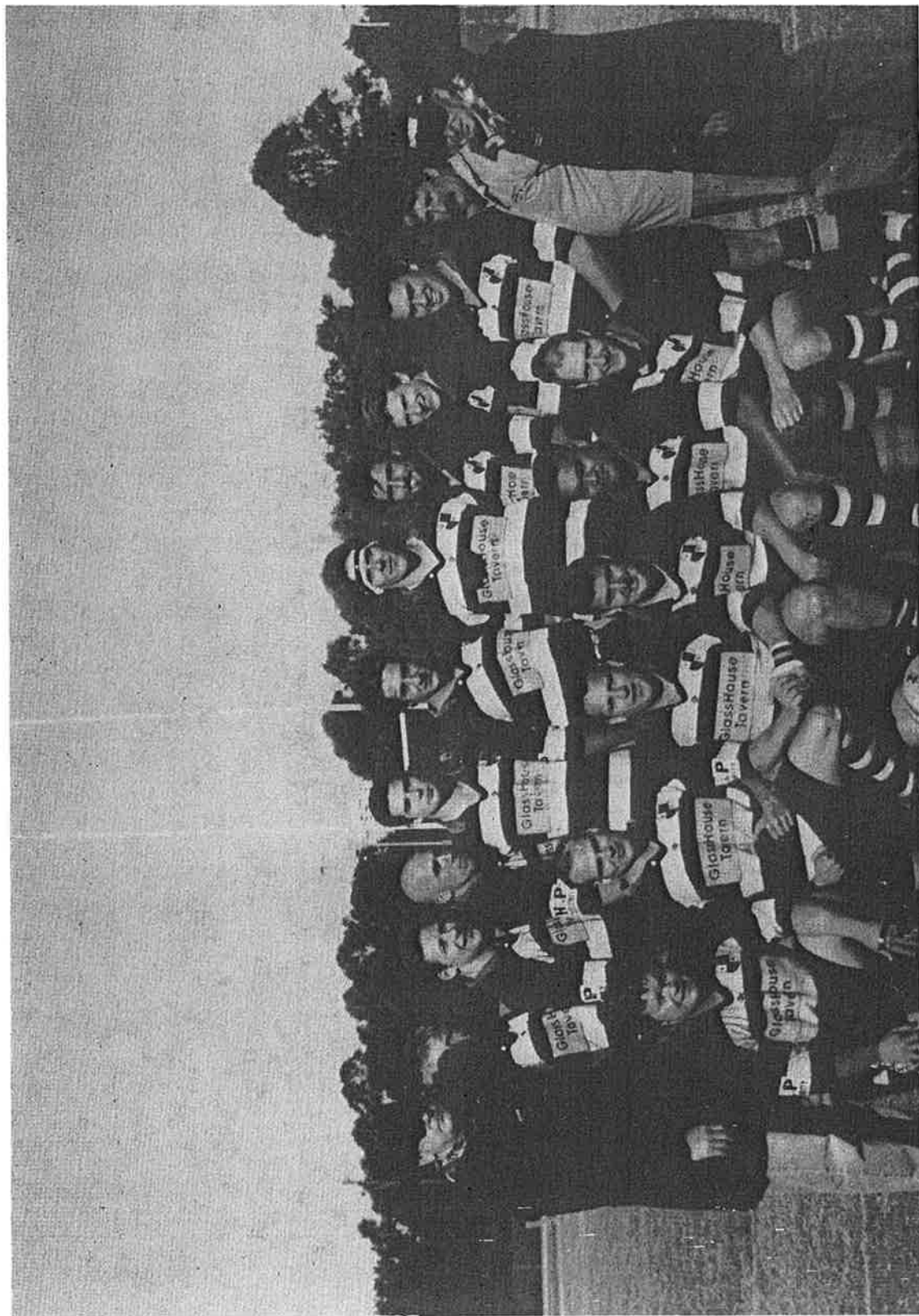

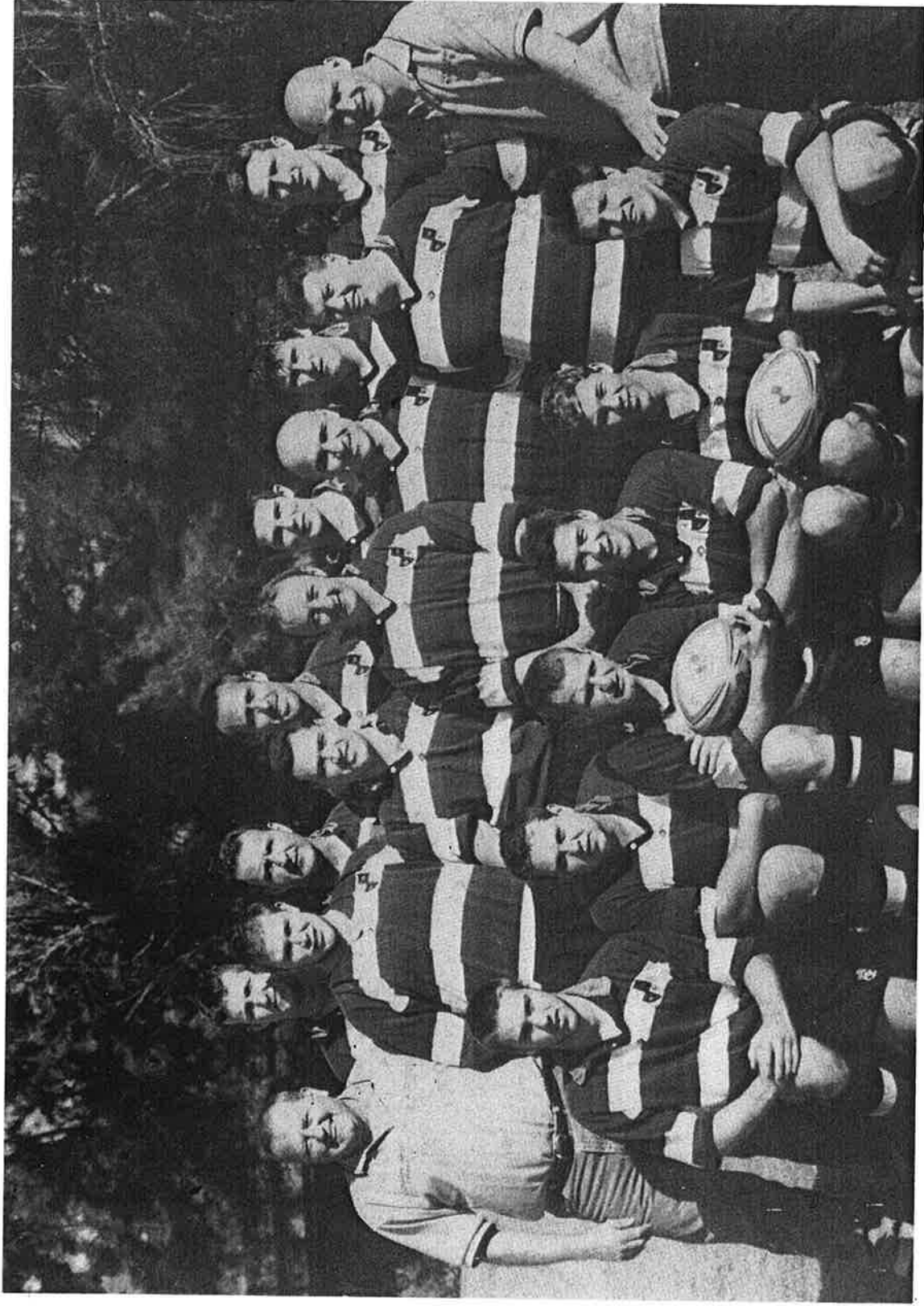

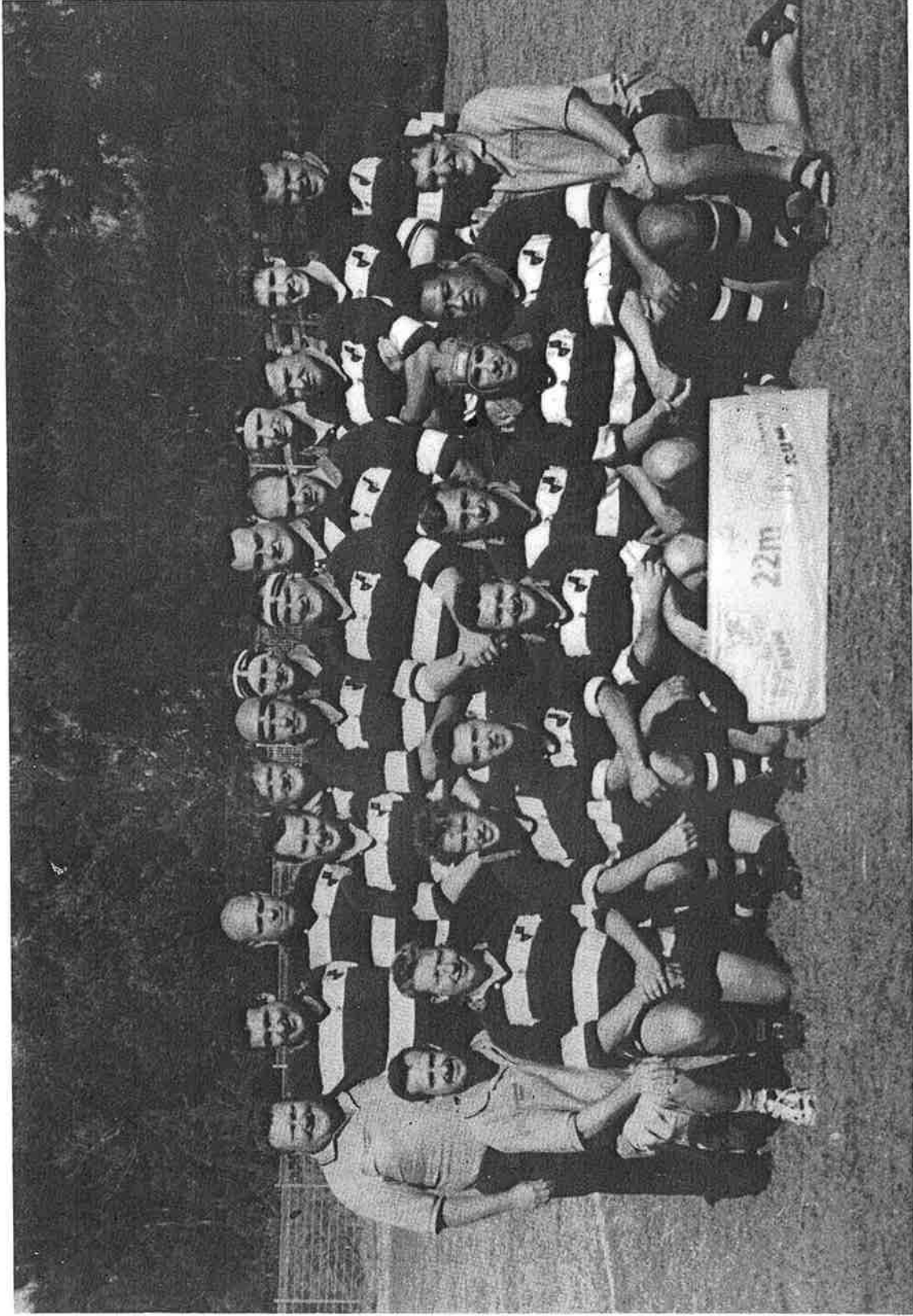

A FEW GOOD PROPS

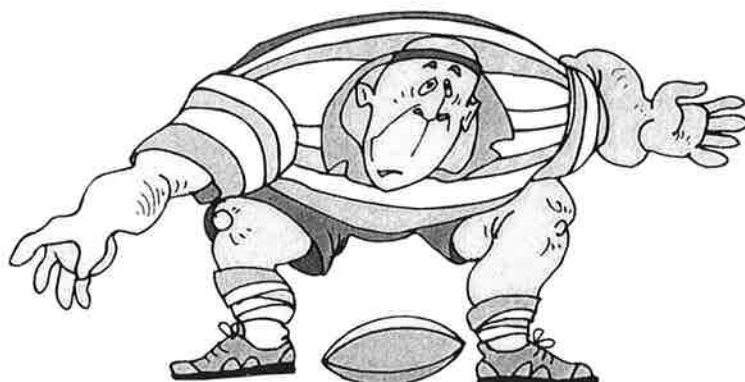
