

### Tech Waratahs Rugby Club Club Managers Report 2001

### Rugby Review

The season just completed is one that added a number of positive gains to our club the rugby standard overall is improving with the availability of a pool of players increasing to lift the standard overall throughout the club.

Our rugby club is continuing in the process of changing from one that accepted defeat on the field as the normal way of our game to one that considers anything less than doing our very best is not acceptable at all.

This is a very healthy and positive outlook for any sporting group and may I suggest if we don't continue to strive for this vision our objectives and all our efforts are doomed to failure.

Each grade of course has its reasons why they didn't achieve the goal of a premiership and its not my intention to reason those in this report, sufficient to say that as a rugby club we are given the status of having a very competitive club that can't be taken lightly in any grade by our opposition.

The player's register indicates we had ninety-nine male and eighteen female players actually take the field to represent the club. This is another strong indicator of a healthy club continuing to build its player base for the future.

Apart from struggling to gain a sufficient pool of under nineteen players early in the season all other grades were able to look to the bench for reserves, which makes the whole team that much more flexible in selections and coping with the numerous hurdles the individual teams and the club has to face throughout the season.

Numerous club players were selected for the various representative teams, which contribute to the depth of knowledge and skills of the rugby brought back into the club. This aspect is always encouraged in our club as it provides others that are not in our club a very positive outlook of the clubs ability to attract and hold such players.

Of course it would be remiss of me if I didn't make special mention of our premiership winning ladies team who showed the way and brought great credit to themselves and the club by winning their competition.

Club appreciation must go to those few ladies who stuck in there at the beginning of the year when we only had five or six players, they did the work to attract others and build a team of champions. The coaches Wolf and Ziggy also deserve cedit for their part in getting their team into a position were they could win, well done.

It is not my intention in this report to specify any details about each grade as this is done elsewhere throughout the team coaches and managers reports, sufficient to say that overall the club has taken another step building toward that time when all teams will have the ability, strength, numbers and attitude that will take the Illawarra District Rugby Union competition to another level with one club winning it all. I know this sounds a bit much but that should be our goal.

As your club manager it falls upon me to try and head off difficulties that are certain to happen for one reason or another through the season and in the rugby side of things. This year I have to say we had a very dedicated group of coaches and support staff that worked very well together to gain the best results they could under the circumstances presented to them each week.

### Club Review

Once again, it goes without saying, if you don't have a dedicated committee that sets up and administers the functions required to survive, maintain and build our club it wouldn't be around very long.

This year we have been fortunate to have a few new members put up their hand to be elected and take on the various positions required to implement and control the workings of our club.

Most committee members do the job because they want to help the club and its members do the very best we can, they all deserve our thanks because a lot of the work is done behind the scenes that members never see, so on your behalf I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for your personal and collective efforts this year.

I would be lying if I said we didn't have a few drama's throughout the season, as with most things they pass and we get on with the job required to do the best we can for the benefit of the club overall. Generally speaking once an issue is dealt with it provides a building block for future reference and decision making, so it's not all negative.

The committee was informed that the Tafe and Student Association are considering the building of extensions onto the present complex at Saunders Oval; this may have an impact on our current facilities. It is very early days but the club committee has to ensure that any future changes must contain the considerations of our rugby club.

Financial matters are always an important aspect of the club and this year we were very fortunate to continue at the same level as last year. Although I must admit things did get a little difficult when our previous major sponsor basically forced us to find another prior to the season starting.

The Cabbage Tree Hotel took up the challenge which has been difficult in that they were new owners and have a lot of work to do in refurbishing their

establishment so to agree to be our major sponsors for this year was very much appreciated.

In this regard I believe the club is fortunate in having a life member that has put a great deal of time and effort into this aspect of negotiating and arranging sponsorships. On behalf of the club I take the opportunity to thank Barry McVicar for all his hard work.

The clubs canteen is another facility that is very important to the financial position of the club. ### **UNDER 19'S REPORT**

Once again we dominated the Illawarra awards with Kasey being voted by the referees as best player of the year and Larissa being leading points scorer.



Gold Coast sling shot bugee. Surprising all had guts of steel not one showed what they had eaten from the night before.




Once landed and back to Wollongong the subject of conversation had the boys thinking of next year's trip. The only thing holding us back was getting over this one.
