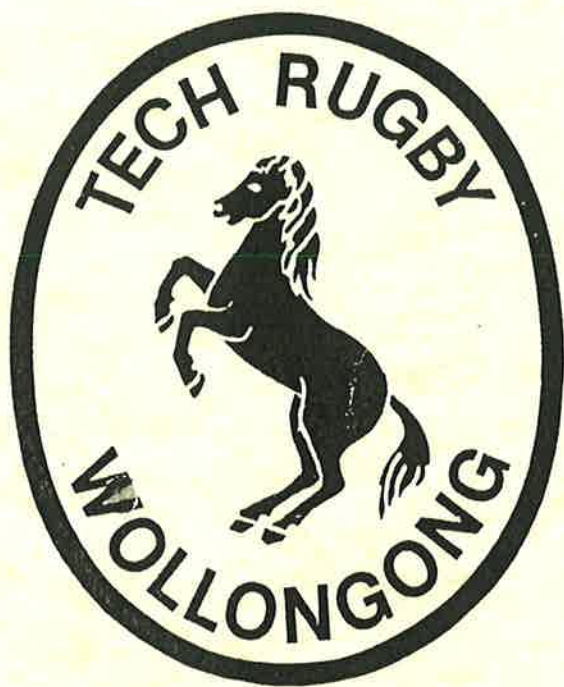

TREASURER'S REPORT

Financially, 1993 has not been as successful as 1992. The main revenue has been derived from Tattersall's Hotel weekly raffles, instant party raffle and bar takings.

On behalf of the committee, I would like to sincerely thank all those members who conducted the Tatt's raffle each Friday. Up to September 16th, our net income was \$3,929, this income is extremely valuable to the club so keep up the good work.

Food and beverage sales were reasonable with a profit of approx. \$4,000, this being comparable with 1992 figures. One should take note that there were two home games less this year.

A disappointing aspect of our finances is our shortfall between the monies collected for registration and the fees charged by I.D.R.U. Fees collected totalled \$2,400. The club paid I.D.R.U. \$5,000, a shortfall of \$2,600, so if you are one who has not paid his fees, please hand it to a club committee person.

At present I am unable to give a full financial statement of the club's finances as a formal audit has not been conducted.

COACH'S REPORT

1st Grade

The 1993 season started slowly with the major concern being a Front Row Forward. The Club was in full pre-season training with the four Coaches heavily involved with training session.

We had good numbers at training and as usual President Barry had been able to pull off a coup by gaining the services of the Welsh Hooker, Nigel Meek, and in addition Karl Fenton from Nottingham and Paul Taylor from Pontypool were also coming.

Unfortunately Tony Naulty became ill and stepped down and so with some reluctance I moved from 2nd Grade to become 1st Grade Coach. Suffice to say my original reluctance was well founded as I realised that being 1st Grade Coach is a high pressure job. If the team wins things are great but if they lose it's quite the opposite. The team and the Club suffer as some members believe that the little problems are in fact big problems.

Generally speaking 1st Grade training sessions were well attended however I would have to say that the dedication and commitment left a lot to be desired if we are ever to become a good side.

The trip to Batemans Bay to play their representative side did provide the team with a good win and hope to change our showing in the competition. Throughout the season each individual player in the 1st Grade squad had something to offer the team. However, either due to my inability to emphasise the need for teamwork or the lack of mature 1st Grade experience, we lacked the ability to reap the benefits of a lot of hard work on the field.

There were many games throughout the season when at half time the opposition were on their knees but we just couldn't continue the pressure in a fashion which stopped them from turning the game in their favour.

The vast majority of the team are young players with a great deal of potential to become very good rugby players. But it takes a great deal of personal dedication and commitment from each player before a good rugby team can be formed.

On many occasions various players showed their skills with little reward - perhaps only a pat on the back from fellow team mates or a rise in their own self esteem. For myself, one of the very positive results of the season was the selection of two Under 19s Dave Williamson and Glen Cooper in the 1st Grade team. Both proved that they have got what it takes to become very good rugby players. This is also true of many other players in the lower grades.

Considering our good showing in the 1992 season we had high expectations for 1993 - but we were sadly disappointed.

As the season wore on injuries, losses and a cruel draw started to take their toll but to their credit the Players tried to get that elusive competition win which finally came against Weerona.

It would be wrong of me not to make special mention of one player (although I have tried not to highlight individuals) who in my opinion deserves my personal thanks within this report. His dedication to the team by travelling long distances to training, his support and most importantly playing to his ability in any position for the benefit of the team did not go unnoticed. I tip my hat to Dave Evans - thank you for your efforts both on and off the field. I sincerely wish there were more with your fortitude - if there were we would be a well respected Club.

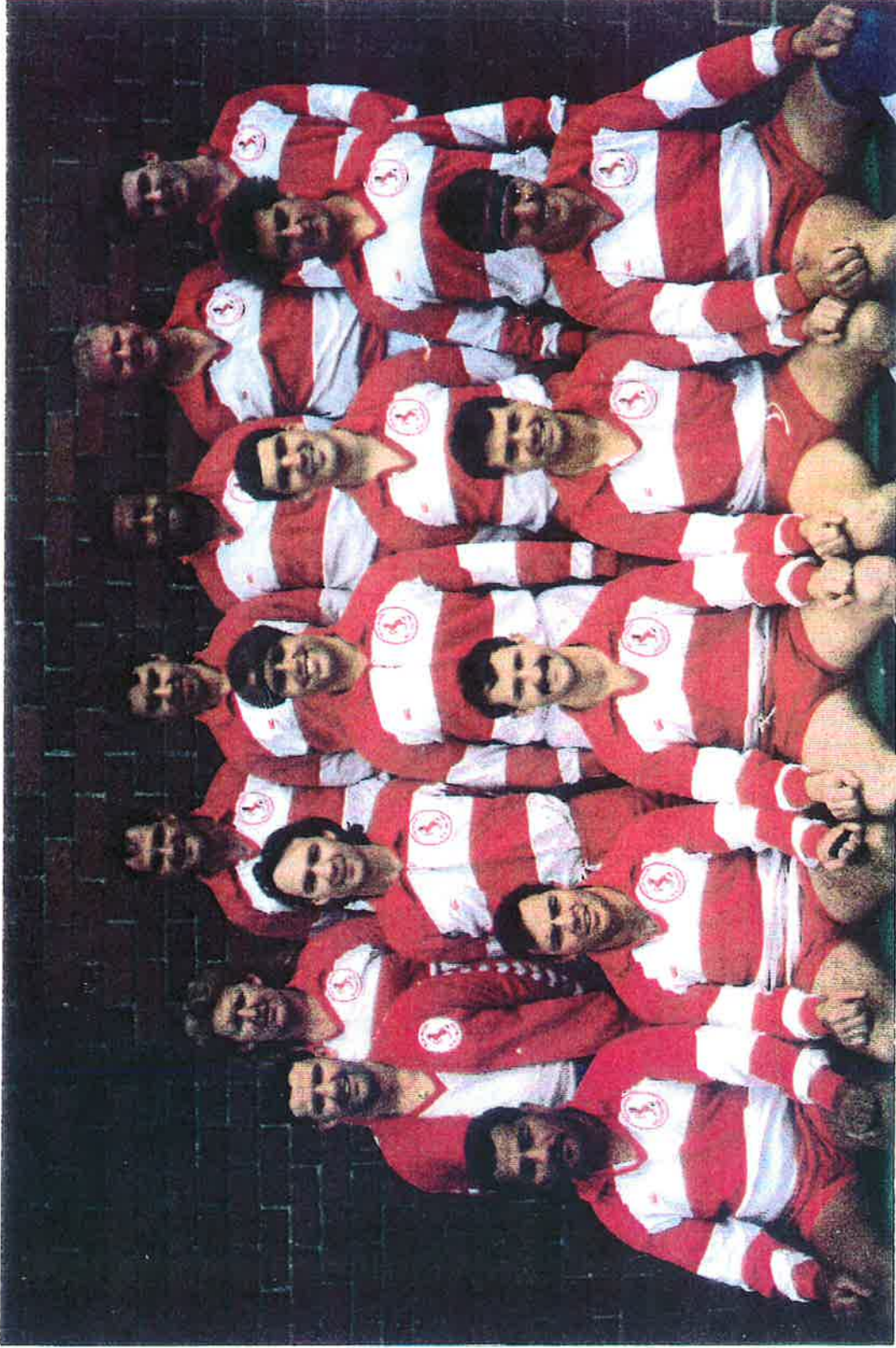
