## SECOND GRADE REPORT

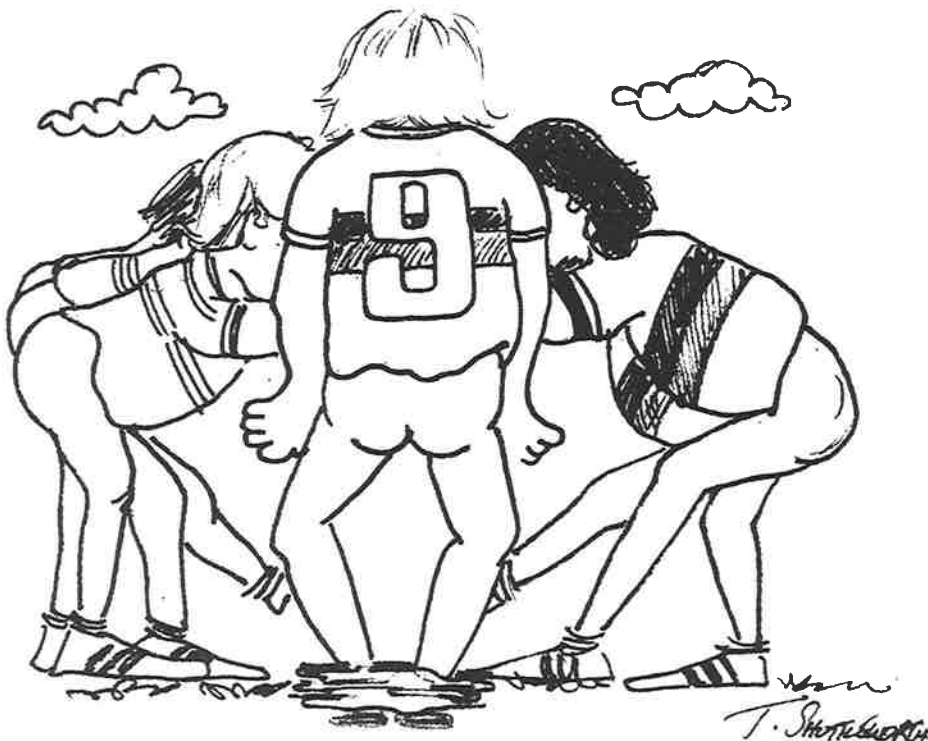
