1ST GRADE MANAGER'S REPORT

Tim had arranged for two previous senior players to assist him with the 1st grade team as assistants but due to circumstances this didn't happen, this placed a great deal of extra pressure on Tim to cover all the requirements of a coach whilst still being the captain and playing to his own high standards.

Our season started by playing last year's premiers which was a bummer as our first game of the season. With a lot of newly selected players in the top grade the team struggled to get any continuity and this was the theme for the first four games with losses being posted. Then we had a couple of wins and things looked promising. But, a number of season ending injuries to players in key positions really made it difficult to keep the team momentum improving and consolidating into a settled team, which would allow the players to get game time gaining the necessary understanding of their own and fellow player's strengths and weaknesses.
