PRESIDENTS REPORT

1987 was a holiday year for the Waratahs. After the dizzy heights of a 1986 premiership, we all settled back to cruise through 1987, and very few people were prepared to duplicate the effort that brought the success in all grades in 1986.

I would like to think that some very valuable lessons have been learned. The most important lesson is the role that commitment plays in success. Where there is no commitment, there is no success. We have just spent the 1987 season proving that beyond any doubt.

Off the field, 1987 was quite successful. Our move to the Wollongong City Bowling Club has been a mutually satisfying and rewarding liaison. Our profit sharing arrangement has provided financial security for both the Waratahs and the Bowling Club. The Club premises have provided us with a pleasant meeting place and an ideal venue for all our social functions. The most successful of these was Peter King's Polynesian Night. The Club was packed, the entertainment was excellent and everyone enjoyed themselves.

Our membership of the Bowling Club will provide us with a secure home on a long term basis, plus financial assistance, provided that we patronise the Club at every opportunity, both individually, and as a group whether it is football season or not. Call in on Fridays for the meat raffle at 5.30 p.m.

Our return to Keira Oval was a welcome one. Due to the efforts of our gardener, Harold, the playing surface was the best in the district. We spent \$1500.00 on improving our training lights, which allowed the use of nearly all the available space, making team training more comfortable and less hazardous.

Even though our fund raising activities during the year weren't as successful as we had hoped, we still had a good year financially. We should finish in the black, even though our expenditure has been high. The 400 club was hard work for little reward, and we won't be attempting any more of those. Easier money was the Cans Raffle, and next year we will concentrate on ventures of a similar nature. Projects where we can do something as a Club are rewarding and we will be looking for more of those in the future. The delivery of the telephone books, and the hosting of the semi-final are good examples, and hopefully they will be on again next year.

For a couple of years we have been planning a scholarship arrangement whereby one of our promising young players is given the opportunity to play Rugby overseas to gain experience, and bring that experience back for the benefit of the player and ultimately his team mates and the Club.

During 1987 it was announced that the first recipient of the Scholarship was John Kinnear, and he flew to England some weeks ago to join the Headingley Club in the north of England.

John was chosen not only for his outstanding natural ability, but also for his excellent attitude towards his fitness, his team, his coach and his Club. We are all very proud of John and his achievements, and we send him to England knowing that he will maintain his usual high standards both on and off the field.

We were also very happy during the year to assist

Peter Palmer to further his Rugby career in England during our off season. As everyone knows Peter's career has already reached very high standards with his firm grip on the N.S.W. hooker spot for a number of years, and many tours abroad. We hope that his stint in England will further broaden his Rugby knowledge, and that the experience he gains will benefit our younger players next year and in the future.

A satisfying aspect of 1987 was the strength and enthusiasm of our juniors. While we nominated sides in Under 13, 15 and 17 competitions, we were unable to field an Under 17 side, and this meant that some players in that age group were unable to get regular football and that was very disappointing. Moves have already been made to remedy that situation for next year, and we will be fielding a full complement of strong junior sides.

The Under 15's also suffered from time to time from lack of numbers, but played very well all season, and didn't let themselves or their club down at any time.

The highlight of the year was the performance of the undefeated Premiers - the Under 13's. These boys showed the rest of the Club what commitment can achieve. Coach Bob Kerr did a tremendous job, and the boys listened and learned. The whole club is looking forward to watching the progress of this team through the age divisions and into grade. There is little doubt that the 1987 Under 13's side will form the backbone of the Waratahs 1st grade side in some future year.

Our Under 19 Colts performed well, but again were short of numbers on some occasions. Many players doubled up each weekend after playing Grade football on Saturdays. Our Club policy is not to promote players to Grade before they are ready, but it is difficult for a senior coach to resist promoting talented young players into his side. It is also difficult for the Colts player to resist the challenge of playing Grade. As all these players can no longer be classified as juniors, senior Rugby is well within their capacity, and the problem of having young players clamouring for a spot in a senior team is a problem I hope we will always have.

The Thirsty Thirds acquitted themselves very well to reach the qualifying semi final before being eliminated. Training was disrupted throughout the year by shift work and study commitments, and Graeme Parsons did a good job to mould a successful side under difficult circumstances.

Graeme was one of the players who joined us this year after previously playing for Port Kembla. We were very happy that these players chose to join the Waratahs when every club in the district was chasing them. I realise the difficulties involved in settling into a new club, and I appreciate the effort that you fellows made, and I hope you enjoyed your first season with the Waratahs. You are all now an integral part of the Club, and we can look forward to plenty of successful seasons in the future.

Our major sponsor in 1987 was Don Cameron Real Estate Wollongong, who's contribution ensured a financially successful year. Throughout the year, Hank Schumacher became not only a sponsor, but also a good supporter, and attended many of our games and social functions. Hank, the Club sincerely appreciates your assistance in 1987, and we hope the arrangement has been mutually satisfying.

I would also like to acknowledge the assistance of Kerry Neuman's Crown Central Chickens which allowed us to purchase the very distinctive tracksuits that our players wore on the sideline while standing by as reserves. Kerry, we noted that you also watched many of our games, and we appreciate your support and your assistance.

Even though a number of people during the year made a large contribution to the running of the Club, including Gary Graham, Ron Wessel, Janette Bryant, Peter King, Mick and Sue Smith and others the selection of Clubman of the Year was almost automatic.

It is not often that a Coach gets too involved in the administrative affairs of the Club, but Bob Kerr is an exception. Not only did Bob coach our top grade under difficult circumstances, he also guided the youngest Waratahs to a premiership. His contribution as Sponsorship Officer was invaluable, and his assistance and advice during the year were appreciated. His trip to England at his own expense early in the year created many contacts for the Club, and opened the way for our Rugby Scholarship to become a reality, as well as paving the way for future player exchange. Bob's contribution in 1987 will ensure a successful future for the Waratahs for years to come.

Thank you for the opportunity to be the President of the Waratahs again in 1987. I regard 1987 as a year of learning and consolidation, just when we thought we knew everything and had it all organised. The year has laid the foundation to be better organised and more successful in the future, and I'm looking forward to being a part of it.
