Finally, I should mention the game against Tech which we drew and earned our only official point for the year. In summing up, a very, very disappointing year, I'm sure you will agree and for me personally the most frustrating and mind blowing experience in rugby union in my life.

My appreciation goes to Chris Norris and Bill Barker, two frustrated captains who thought too close an association, and lack of co-operation from older players, could not govern with ease. Then along came "cyclone Darby" with no respect for your father being president thank you very much, had a no nonsense attitude, stood on a few toes, kicked a few bums, and in my estimation held the side together by example and exemplary leadership till the final, inevitable whistle. For their co-operation, my thanks to Mick Wilkins and Dick Ruse, I think your lot was harder than mine. Also for services rendered, but not forgotten, my thanks to Sally Reid, Gary Graham, Rod Coleshill and Ron Wessel.

Finally may I wish you all the very best of luck for the 1985 season.

## SECOND GRADE REPORT

Finally, may I thank Dick Ruse for his efforts as trainer and Sally Reed for her valuable assistance and advice. The Club would be poorer without the special talents of these people.

Thanks also to every bloke who played in 2nd Grade in 1984 We did the best we could together — it wasn't good enough — but from here the only way is up!!
